**JILL MOSS GREENBERG OF THE MARYLAND  
WOMEN'S HERITAGE CENTER SPEAKS AT THE  
EXCLUSIVELY FOR WOMEN EXPO**

**Jill Moss Greenberg is the Keynote Speaker at the Expo on Saturday,  
May 10 at 1:30 p.m. at Ripken Stadium in Aberdeen, Md.**

*Topic of her Keynote Speech is "Women Leading the Past, Present, and Future"*

**BALTIMORE** – Jill Moss Greenberg, Executive Director of the Maryland Women's Heritage Center, has been tapped to serve as the keynote speaker at the first Exclusively For Women Expo on Saturday, May 10 at Ripken Stadium in Aberdeen, Md. She will speak on "Women Leading the Past, Present, and Future" at 1:30 p.m. Jill Moss Greenberg is a resident of Hyattsville, Md.

Jill Moss Greenberg is Executive Director of the Maryland Women's Heritage Center, the first state project of its kind in the nation, which will provide a place to learn about the many accomplishments and contributions of Maryland's diverse women. Throughout her life, she has fought to reduce all types of discrimination—sexism, racism, handicappism, and ageism.

While still in junior high school, she joined and worked for the Civil Rights movement, and as a college student, she and a friend convinced the United Cerebral Palsy to donate space for a pre-school for disabled children, a facility that would become one of the first of its kind established in the United States.

Jill Moss Greenberg represented Prince George's County on the Maryland State Commission for Women and led in the creation of the Prince George's County Commission for Women. She initiated the first task forces to address child care and aging and participated in the establishment of the Task Force on Women with Disabilities. Jill founded the Maryland Women's History Project and played a significant role in the passage of the Maryland Equal Rights Amendment, the Equal Credit Opportunity Act, and Title IX, a federal law that requires schools that receive federal funds to prohibit gender discrimination. She co-founded the Maryland and Prince George's County women's political caucuses, served on the original Finance Committee of the National Women's Political Caucus, and was a "founding mother" of the Women's Center and Referral Service, in addition to participating in the development of many programs throughout the county, state and country that assist women and children.

She also worked as the Race Equity Specialist for the Maryland State Department of Education, Director of Multicultural Education at the Mid-Atlantic Equity Consortium, and was the first Executive Director at the Washington, D.C., national headquarters for the National Association for Multicultural Education (NAME).

Jill Moss Greenberg has won numerous awards for her contributions to the fight for equality, including being named to the Maryland Women's Hall of Fame in 1995.

The first-ever Exclusively For Women Expo, "A Day That Inspires," will showcase the region's best companies offering products and services created especially for women. In addition to more than 50

The Maryland Women’s Heritage Center was established to preserve the past, understand the present, and shape the future by recognizing, respecting, and transmitting the experiences and contributions of Maryland women of diverse backgrounds and from all regions of the state. The first effort of its kind in the nation, it provides a place to learn and teach about the contributions of Maryland women through the State’s history, to develop leadership by girls and women, and to hold forums to address issues impacting on girls, women and their families. The Center is an outgrowth of the Maryland Women’s History Project that began in 1981 as a collaborative venture between the Maryland Commission for Women and the Maryland State Department of Education. It will provide a home to the Maryland Women’s Hall of Fame, which has inducted outstanding women since 1985, coordinated by the Women Legislators of Maryland and the Maryland Commission for Women.
