Call for Nominations

The Maryland Commission for Women and the Women Legislators of the Maryland General Assembly are issuing a call for nominations for the 2018 Maryland Women's Hall of Fame and the Maryland Women of Tomorrow Awards. The honorees for both the Women's Hall of Fame and the Women of Tomorrow will be recognized at a ceremony in Annapolis in March 2018.

2018 Maryland Women's Hall of Fame

The Hall of Fame was established in 1985 to honor Maryland women who have made significant and lasting contributions in their field of endeavor. Candidates may be either posthumous or contemporary and must be Maryland women whose achievements are of historic significance in fields such as the arts, athletics, business, community advocacy, education, government, the humanities, human rights, law, medicine, the military, philanthropy, and science. Candidates may be nominated by organizations or by individuals.

Complete nomination submissions for the Maryland Women's Hall of Fame must be emailed or postmarked by 4 p.m. on Friday, October 27, 2017.

2018 Maryland Women of Tomorrow Awards

The Women of Tomorrow Awards program was established in 1997 to recognize young women in middle school and high school who have achieved records of academic excellence, extraordinary community service and outstanding leadership.

Schools, individuals and organizations in Maryland are invited to nominate young women for this award.

All nominations for the Women of Tomorrow Award must be emailed or postmarked by 4 p.m. on Thursday, November 9, 2017.
