ABOUT THE AWARD WINNER Margaret Dunkle was nominated by the Calvert County Board of Commissioners and is being recognized for her leadership and lifelong advocacy efforts for equal opportunity and women's rights. Most recently, Margaret chaired the Harriet Elizabeth Brown Commemoration Task Force, where she worked to identify ways to honor the legacy of one of Calvert County's civil rights pioneers. Margaret also played a central role in the implementation of Title IX, the 1972 landmark legislation prohibiting sex discrimination in schools receiving federal funding that is most commonly associated with equity in college athletics. A Maryland native, Margaret also serves as the Chair of the Calvert County Commission for Women and was a 2012 inductee to the Maryland Women's Hall of Fame.

About the Award Comptroller Peter Franchot created the William Donald Schaefer Helping People Award in 2012 to honor the legacy of public service exemplified by former Governor, Comptroller and Baltimore City Mayor William Donald Schaefer. Nominees are sought from throughout the state. The nominations are reviewed and recipients selected in 23 counties and Baltimore City. The honorees are selected based on their demonstration to improve the community; to promptly respond to a citizen problem through effective government intervention; to directly aid those most vulnerable in society; or to establish a public/private partnership to improve the lives of fellow Marylanders.
